

Reducing Acid Rain

Can human ingenuity solve acid rain? Acid rain is an environmental issue that affects plants and animal life, lakes and rivers, buildings and structures, and human beings. Precipitation that contains acidic gases such as sulphur dioxide or nitrogen oxide has the potential to cause serious environmental problems. Since the 1060s scientists have studied the harmful results of acid rain and looked for ways to reduce harmful atmospheric pollutants (Acid Rain, 2010). The "scientific community has recognized acid rain as a serious environmental threat and has developed technological equipment to help reduce pollution into the air" (Anderson, 2012, p. 28). In the past few years, technological advancements have successfully reduced the negative effects of acid rain.

Some large automotive companies have used technology to control dangerous emissions and are now using energy more efficiently. Others have gone further and invented cars that emit much less carbon dioxide into the environment. An example of this environmentally friendly car is the Prius, now marketed by Toyota. According to Road and Transportation Research, Toyota is significantly reducing emissions:
